

2018 BMXNZ SOUTH ISLAND TITLES

EVENT INFORMATION



This sheet is BMXNZ's easy to follow **A to Z** of event information. Please read & share with everyone who is participating in or going to visit this event.

ADDRESS & PARKING

The venue based in Kyle Park, Hornby, Christchurch. The **main** entrance is from Waterloo Road. Parking will be allowed in Kyle Park but only as directed. Please follow instructions of the marshals.

ALCOHOL & SMOKING

All BMXNZ Major Events are Smoke, Drug & Alcohol Free (as are all Christchurch City parks). Please adhere to this ruling, it is for the benefit of the riders & children at the South Island Titles Event venue.

ANIMALS

The event is a BMXNZ major meeting where the focus is on the riders & preparation, so NO pets are permitted at the venue other than registered Working or Guide Dogs.

BANNERS

Club banners are to be attached to club tents only, do not hang them over any existing signage around the track. Offending Banners will be removed. If you wish to promote other products or services, please contact the club to arrange an approved display location.

CAMPER SITES

As per the Christchurch City Council Parks and Reserves Bylaws there is no camping allowed in Kyle Park.

EZEVENTING

Moto draws & results will be available on the EZeventing site – please note that nothing will be posted prior to the close of registration on the Friday morning. After this time **ALL** challenge moto draws will be available. Please note that EZeventing updates roughly every 5 minutes so there can be a small time lapse between motos finishing & semi's being uploaded. All classes will also be posted to points boards in a timely manner.

OPENING CEREMONY

Begins at 10:35am on Saturday the 13th January 2018

NQMs

For the South Island Titles, riders must complete all motos to qualify for an NQM. If you miss any motos due to injury at the event, please make sure you supply the event rider advocate with all the paper work from the medical team to confirm your situation.

PIT GAZEBOS

There is an open location policy for all club Gazebos within the region defined areas, first in first served. No gazebos will be allowed to erected prior to official practice. Gates will open at 2.30pm Friday 12th January for access to install your gazebos. No gazebos are allowed along the finish straight area due to a Council exclusion zone. No parking of vehicles inside of the facility fences, all cars to please stay in parking areas.



PRACTICE TIMES

Please see the Official flyer for the practice times. The Club may offer open track time prior to the official times, please see the Club Website or Facebook page for information. For any official practice session, riders without an official South Island Titles plate on will be asked to leave the staging area & will not participate in any official practice session.

PRIZE GIVING

Prize giving will be held approximately 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last race on Sunday the 14th January. Prize giving will be on the Trailer Podium behind the staging tents & is for all classes.

PROTESTS

During the course of the meeting Team Managers are the spokesperson for their club riders should they have a concern regarding issues on or off the track.

If an issue arises, a protest by a rider may be filed through the rider's Team Manager, with the Appeals Commissaire Doug McEhinney who will be positioned near the finish line area. Please ensure you have a copy of the latest rule book (Version 06.17.H) to assist you in deciding if a protest is required. The protests must be submitted by the rider's team manager to the Appeals Commissaire within 15 minutes of the posting of the results that has given rise to the protest. The Appeals Commissaire will conduct an investigation and render a decision on the protest prior to the commencement of that rider's next round of racing.

RACING START TIMES

Please see the Official flyer for start times – ensure all riders head to staging at least 10 minutes prior to start of the first race to ensure racing starts on time.

RACE FORMAT

Please see the Official flyer for race format – the following detail is the pending format as it currently stands. (before medicals are pulled out & class numbers change):

Classes racing 4 motos Saturday & 3 motos Sunday – **POINTS OVER** (8 or less in their class) – 6 & Under Mixed, 7-8 Girls, 9-10 Girls, 11 Girls, 12 Girls, 15 Boys, 15 Girls, 16 Boys, 16 Girls, 17+ Female 20", 17-24 Male 20", 25-29 Male 20", 30-39 Male 20", 13-16 Cruiser Male, 50+ Cruiser Male.

Classes racing 4 motos Saturday & 2 motos Sunday followed by **SEMIs** & then deadman finals – 7 Boys, 9 Boys, 10 Boys, 11 Boys, 12 Boys.

ALL other classes not listed above will race 4 motos Saturday & 2 motos Sunday, then to a deadman final.

Please note the format can change once registration is complete & all medicals are taken into effect.

Please note that all motos & lane draws are random mixed, by the BMXNZ event system.

RAFFLE

Once again through very generous local companies there are some awesome prizes up for grabs in the raffle. Make sure you grab your raffle tickets early. These are sure to sell out. \$2 a ticket.

REFUNDS

NO refunds will be authorised after Friday 12 January at the close of rego at 5.00 pm. Refunds prior to this time will be given on receipt of a medical certificate less an administration fee of \$20. Please email medical certificates to admin@bmxnz.co.nz or give to your Team Manager to hand in at the admin hut during registration.



REGISTRATION

Registration to collect rider's plates is to be done by **TEAM MANAGERS ONLY**. They will be issued with a returns sheet to write down any riders that are not racing. They will return this sheet to admin by 8:30am on Saturday. If the sheet is not returned it is presumed that all of your club riders are racing & they will be in the Moto Draws which once issued can not be changed.

Team Managers can collect plates strictly between 4pm and 5pm on Friday or between 8am and 8:30am on Saturday. Do not ask outside of these times. Plates will not be issued to individual riders (except international riders) at the admin hut.

RIDER PACKS

The Christchurch community has come to the party and provided some great sponsorship to enable all riders to receive an awesome race pack which will be given to your Team Manager's to distribute with the plates.

RUBBISH

It is everyone's responsibility to ensure that you keep your pit or club area tidy & place all rubbish in the bins provided.

SHOPS

Christchurch City has a brilliant team running a shop at Souths providing tasty food for your empty bellies, cold drinks for thirsty riders or maybe just a wee treat or snack for you. There will also be two coffee vendors on site and two BMX shops.

UCI CN EVENT

Riders are to individually check in at the admin hut either on Friday between 4pm & 5pm or on Saturday between 8am & 8:30am. If riders do not check in they will be called for via the commentary team – failure to show up to the admin hut after this call means they will be deleted from the moto draw.

The UCI CN Class prizegiving will done at the first available break in motos after the finals have been completed on Saturday the 13th January.
